<b>Note</b>	1.Students are required to meet the requirements set by the Department for “English Proficiency,” and “Professional Certification,” in addition to earning the required number of credits to be eligible for graduation. 2.Before graduation, students are required to take at least one required cornerstone course offered by another college. The credits earned from such courses may be recognized as part of the credits under the category of Liberal Arts Education, but only a maximum of four credits will be recognized accordingly.
